**OLD BUSINESS:**

2. Motion by Deputy Mayor Ford, seconded by Councilwoman Lasich to approve the minutes of the August 14<sup>th</sup>, 2018 and August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 meetings of City Council. **All in favor – 5-0**

**CITIZEN COMMENTS:**

Carol Hoffman – thanked the City for looking into the door with insulation showing situation.

Francis Booker – thanked the City for cutting the grass at 875 School Street.

Wanda Allen – 300 block of Mitchell Avenue there is debris on the sewer grates preventing water from getting in. Also there are two trees at Mitchell and Third Avenues that need to come down. Also a problem with people riding dirt bikes and ATV's in the area.

Barbara McCullough – Pot holes on Madison Avenue and the back door of 904 Madison needs boarded up. Kids are getting in there and using the backroom.

Kathy Tachoir – Free flu shot scheduled should be released soon and she is in opposition to making Waddell Avenue from 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Street a two-way street again. Would like Council to reconsider.

Judy Anderson – Thank you for having the lot to the right of her house cut, garage at 329 Crest needs cut along with the lot that Wells Fargo Bank owns, where the demolition was done, on Lincoln Way why are the lots for sale?, Any idea when Worthington Avenue will be open and the City should approach U.S. Steel about having a Promise Program like they have in Pittsburgh.

Bessie James – Wanted to thank the City again for cutting the lot across the street from her.

Donna Vankirk – DeMarco trucks have been dumping at the end of Gary Avenue by 12<sup>th</sup> Street.

George Berry – Received a letter about cutting back trees and he doesn't even own the property and the City needs an educational / recreational center for all.

Jackie Wade – questioned about a recreation center being built on the Fiore property and said that the safety of kids is extremely important and should be a top priority.

Motion by Councilman Kurta, seconded by Councilwoman Johnson-Clemmons approving Resolution No. 1718 authorizing the submission of a grant application to the Allegheny County Conservation District Dirt, Gravel & Low Volume Roads Program for a storm water drainage and bank stabilization project on the City owned property located between Pennsylvania and Connecticut Avenues, designated as lot & block 657-K-45. **All in favor – 5-0**

3. Motion by Deputy Mayor Ford, seconded by Councilman Kurta approving Change Order No. 1 for the 2018 Milling and Resurfacing Contract with Independent Enterprises, Inc. in the amount of \$ 26,213.25 for additional paving on Boundary Avenue and Pittsburgh Street. **All in favor – 5-0**
4. Motion by Deputy Mayor Ford, seconded by Councilwoman Johnson-Clemmons approving the payment of Pay Application No. 2 to DePasquale Construction Services, LLC in the amount of \$ 78,139.18 for work on the ADA Ramps, Sidewalks and Steps Contract. **All in favor – 5-0**
5. Motion by Councilwoman Lasich, seconded by Councilman Kurta to approve and ratify expenditures for General Fund Warrant Nos. 08032018 for \$86,316.00, 08102018 for \$19,303.47, 08172018 for \$15,066.49, 08242018 for \$14,935.21 and 08312018 for \$10,587.81. **All in favor – 5-0**
