Call to Order – Meeting was called to order by Mayor Richard L. Lattanzi, who asked everyone to please stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silent prayer

OLD BUSINESS:

1. City Council met in Executive Session prior to the meeting to discuss a legal issue and a personnel matter.
2. Motion by Councilman Ford, seconded by Councilwoman Lasich to approve the minutes of the January 12th, 2021 Legislative meeting of City Council. **All in favor – 5-0**

CITIZENS COMMENTS:

Jim Cerqua – questions and comments about the referendum petition submitted.

Don Nevills – Questioned if the City is going bankrupt.

Larry Wulf – would like his name removed from the petition. He thought it was about the hook-up fee or the \$50 flat fee.

DuShawn Smith – signed the petition, but would like his name removed since he was told it was about fee reduction.

Joseph Brightman – would like his name removed from the referendum petition

Donna Michael – signed the referendum petition, but would now like her name removed as she was told the petition was to get rid of the \$50 flat fee.

Shron Sloan – feels that children should be allowed to play baseball this summer.

332 Halcomb (name unrecognizable) – kids should be allowed to play baseball this year.

Jessica Ferrero – hope that kids will be allowed to play baseball this summer. All precautions will be taken, contact tracing mask and sanitizing of equipment.

John Vitullo – Is the City going to sell the sewage treatment plant?

Leon Chocinsky – feels that City is doing good and would like his name removed from the petition.

Douglas OzVath – petition circulated was dealing with Ordinance No. 1957 and that is what he told people.

Louise Florenz – Council should let kids play baseball

Armstrong (first name unrecognizable) – would ask that kids be able to play baseball this summer.

Terry Britten – should let the kids play baseball

Sue Vigliotti – West Mifflin is going to play baseball, so why can't Clairton Jobs are going to be cut of the City takes over the plant, because employees there don't all live in Clairton and that is a requirement of current contracts.

Eric Hatchett – City owns parking lot across from his business. Wanted to know if he could use it.

Jackie Wade – wanted to say thank you to Livingston Pharmacy for their doing the covid vaccinations. Does the City have an informational packet that can be handed out to new businesses?

Jeff Trott – wanted to know who makes the decision as to whether the kids can play baseball this summer.

Prior to the City Council starting with New Business, City Manager / Finance Director Howard J. Bednar presented to members of City Council the summary report of the analysis completed of the petition and supplemental petition information submitted by the Referendum Petitioners Committee that lead to the certification and determination of insufficiency in regards to the referendum petition and supplemental petition information submitted to reconsider and repeal City Ordinance No. 1957. The summary report and supporting documentation had been provided to members of Council earlier. The summary report dealt a chronology of letters from the Petitioners Committee to the City and letters from the City manager / Finance Director Howard J. Bednar to the Petitioners Committee and with insufficiencies in the areas of:

- Number of signatures needed
- Duplicate signatures obtained by the Petitioners Committee
- Home Rule Charter requiring a petitioners committee of five (5) qualified voters. Petitioners Committee had six listed members
- Home Rule Charter requiring that the members of the Petitioners Committee are the ones required to obtain signatures. Signatures were obtained by individuals not on the Petitioners Committee
- Home Rule Charter requiring that the full text of the challenged ordinance be “attached” to each paper of the petition. This was not done.
- Signatures from individuals not registered to vote
- Signatures from individuals not registered at the address listed on the County voting list
- Signatures obtained after the circulator signed the notarized affidavit
- Names and or signatures that were illegible to read
- No signatures
- Signatures appearing to be by the hand of another
- Date of signatures are out of sequence or there is no date as required
- Nickname or initials were used in place of the name indicated on the County voting list
- Affidavit be signed using initials and not full name.

The summary report is hereby made part of the minutes.

Motion by Councilwoman Lasich, seconded by Councilman Ford to approve the City Manager / Finance Directors certification and determination of insufficiency in regards to the referendum petition and supplemental petition information submitted to reconsider and repeal City Ordinance No. 1957. **All in favor – 5-0**

Motion by Councilman Ford, seconded by Councilwoman Lasich to adopt Resolution No. 1763 authorizing the filing of an application with the Allegheny County Redevelopment Authority for a Community Infrastructure Tourism Fund (CITF) Grant in the amount of \$150,000 for security cameras and lighting. **All in favor – 5-0**
3. Motion by Councilman Ford, seconded by Councilwoman Lasich to approve the Membership Agreement for the Steel Rivers Council of Governments Regional Training Complex. **All in favor – 5-0**
4. Motion by Deputy Mayor Kurta, seconded by Councilwoman Lasich accepting the proposal from the auditing firm of Maher Duessel to complete the audit of all City funds for the fiscal year 2020 at a cost of \$12,550 and authorizing the City Manager / Finance Director to sign the engagement letter. **All in favor – 5-0**

Motion by Councilman Ford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Kurta approving the purchase of a 2020 Peterbilt Aluminum Dump truck with snow plowing and salting equipment through the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania CoStars 25-044 “piggy-back” contract at a cost of \$149,815.00, with payment through the Community Benefit Trust Fund. **Motion passed 4-0 with one abstention**

7. Motion by Councilman Ford, seconded by Councilwoman Lasich authorizing the donation of \$200.00 to Noble Dresser to be used for his Boy Scout Eagle Scout Project which will take place at the Post 803 VFW on State Street. **All in favor – 5-0**

8. Motion by Deputy Mayor Kurta, seconded by Mayor Lattanzi exonerating the City Administrative / Finance Office for unpaid 2020 City Real Estate taxes in the amount of \$419,494.31. **All in favor – 5-0**
9. Motion by Councilwoman Lasich, seconded by Councilwoman Johnson-Clemmons to extend the discount period for Garbage / Trash Bills by one month to March, April and May. **All in favor – 5-0**

2. Summary of Insufficiencies

1. Number of signatures needed- assume 437
2. Purported signatures obtained by purported petitioners' committee (Committee)- 608 (all duplicate signatures are counted **twice** in this number)
3. The Home Rule Charter requires a petitioners' committee of 5 qualified electors. The Committee has 6 members. Thus, the Committee and its Petitions are incurably deficient. Note we provided notice of this deficiency in the January 8th letter and the Committee did not attempt to cure.
4. The Home Rule Charter requires that petitioner committee members obtain the signatures. Signatures obtained by non-Committee persons eliminates 296 signatures. Note we provided notice of this deficiency in the January 8th letter and the Committee did not attempt to cure.
5. The Home Rule Charter required the full text of the challenged ordinance be "**attached**" to each paper of the petition. The Committee failed to comply with this requirement numerous times. This incurable deficiency eliminates hundreds of signatures.

Putting all of the above incurable deficiencies aside, below summarizes the numerous other deficiencies in the petitions submitted:¹
